


Status of FAA Performance Targets

Commentary (06/2004)

FAA is engaged in a number of new and expanded technical assistance and training programs. The following describes our current and ongoing efforts:

- Continued technical assistance program in Iraq to support the reconstruction of its aviation sector. A four-person FAA team is in place providing a range of assistance and training.
- Continued to coordinate Office of the Secretary of Transportation (OST)-approved plan to help Afghanistan rebuild its national aviation system.
- Continued support of the Secretary's upcoming trip to Japan, China, and Indonesia between July 19-29, which will include his attendance at an Asia Pacific Economic Cooperation (APEC) ministerial meeting in Bali, Indonesia.
- Completed a Flight Standards Seminar on new safety technologies in Hong Kong for Asia-Pacific region civil aviation authorities. The event included 137 participants, 12 civil aviation authorities, 14 U.S. and foreign carriers, the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO), and International Air Transport Association (IATA) representatives.

Status of FAA Performance Targets

- EUROCONTROL accepted the language contained in a new Memorandum of Cooperation covering air traffic cooperative activities and R & D programs with FAA.
- Completed technical activities with China to assist it with the implementation of Required Navigational Performance (RNP).
- Initiated a 3 month study to improve Armenia's safety oversight capabilities. US AID is providing \$250,000 in funding for this project.
- Provided safety training (Extended Range Operations of Airplanes) to civil aviation officials from Cape Verde, Gambia, Liberia, and Senegal
- Continued to work issue of Bahamian request to ICAO to establish its own Flight Information Region.
- Supported a special two day version of the FAA-George Washington University Summit on Aviation Safety and Security for Polish civil aviation officials in Warsaw.
- Preparing for an FAA-George Washington University International Summit on Aviation Safety and Security to be held in Washington between July 19-22. Participants include: Bangladesh, Bhutan, Maldives, Marshall Islands, Micronesia, Mongolia, Nepal, Pakistan, Palau and Sri Lanka.
- Continued the planning for technical assistance, and training to be delivered in the last quarter of FY 2004 to improve the safety oversight capabilities of civil aviation authorities in Argentina, Bahamas, China, Gambia, Kenya, South Korea, Tanzania, Thailand, Uganda, and Uruguay.
