


# Status of FAA Performance Targets

### Commentary (09/2004)

For FY2004, FAA concluded BASA agreements with three countries (Brazil, Iceland, and Singapore), exceeding the goal of two countries.

- Administrator Blakey signed the BASA with Iceland during the ICAO Assembly in Montreal in September 2004.
- The Civil Aviation Authority of China (CAAC) has agreed to the proposed BASA agreement presented by the U.S. earlier this year. CAAC has forwarded the BASA to the Chinese Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MFA) with a recommendation to formalize Chinese acceptance as soon as possible
- The Australian national elections will delay approval of the Australia-U.S. BASA until FY05.
- An FAA team will travel to Kiev to discuss the Ukrainian State Department of Aviation Transport (Ukraviatrans) interest in concluding a BASA with the U. S.
